Christmas is known as a season of giving – offering gifts to others in the love of Christ. Yet we like, the Magi of old, present our gifts only in response to the greatest gift of love given to us by God in the birth of Jesus, God Incarnate. Signs of that great gift are all around us – "stars" shining in everyday life, leading us to recognize God's power, presence, and intervention, causing us to worship. Star Gifts remind us that God is still at work offering us the gifts we need as we follow Jesus each day. You will receive your star gift from the ushers as you leave today. As you receive your gift, consider how you may use it this year. Post it in a prominent place at home or work, and then let your Star Gift shine! Remember, the gift of Jesus is not meant just for your personal benefit; it is meant to help us be the light of Christ to the world.

The Scripture Reading The Gospel of John 1:1-14 (NIV)

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. ⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe.


