The Scripture Reading The Old Testament Lesson Exodus 1:15-2:10 (NIV)

<sup>1:15</sup>The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah, <sup>16</sup> "When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, if you see that the baby is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, let her live." <sup>17</sup>The midwives, however, feared God and did not do what the king of Egypt had told them to do; they let the boys live. <sup>18</sup>Then the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and asked them, "Why have you done this? Why have you let the boys live?" <sup>19</sup>The midwives answered Pharaoh, "Hebrew women are not like Egyptian women; they are vigorous and give birth before the midwives arrive." <sup>20</sup>So God was kind to the midwives and the people increased and became even more numerous.

<sup>21</sup> And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families of their own. <sup>22</sup> Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: "Every Hebrew boy that is born you must throw into the Nile, but let every girl live."

<sup>2:1</sup> Now a man of the tribe of Levi married a Levite woman, <sup>2</sup> and she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. <sup>3</sup> But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. <sup>4</sup> His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him. <sup>5</sup> Then Pharaoh's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe, and her attendants were walking along the riverbank. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her female slave to get it. <sup>6</sup> She opened it and saw the baby. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. "This is one of the Hebrew babies," she said. <sup>7</sup> Then his sister asked Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get one of the Hebrew women to nurse the baby for you?" <sup>8</sup> "Yes, go," she answered. So the girl went and got the baby's mother. <sup>9</sup> Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you." So the woman took the baby and nursed him. <sup>10</sup> When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, "I drew him out of the water."

Mother's Day Reflections from Ms. Penny Bender:

"In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson declared the second Sunday of May an official day to honor mothers.

One of my earliest memories is of roses on Mother's Day. On this special Sunday, you picked either a white or red rose to wear at church. If you did not have a rose bush in your yard, a lovely tray of roses would be available for all church attendees - male or female/young or old. All were encouraged to wear a rose. A red rose was worn if your mother was living and a white rose if your mother was not.

This custom remained throughout my years at the First Baptist Church in New Bern. To my delight when I came to Pollocksville in 1948 as a new bride, this tradition was also observed at our church. Although we know longer honor Mother's Day in this fashion, wouldn't it be nice to start this practice again at our church?"

AND so on Mother's Day, May 8, 2022, Ms. Penny had a tray of red and white paper roses for each member of the congregation to wear to honor their mother in this special way.

One of those projects involves assembling kits for Church World Service. These are kits utilized for feminine hygiene. The following is a list of items for these kits:

Here's what you'll need to make one Pack:

- One 1-gallon size re-sealable bag
- Two 2oz bottle hand sanitizer
- Three 4-gallon bathroom trash bags
- One travel pack of Wet Ones
- •5 regular Tampons
- 5 super absorbency Tampons
- 12 Pads (Unscented. Long super ultra-thin)
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger. No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging)
- One pack of flushable wipes (Unscented, 42 count)
- Six fragrance-free laundry sheets (placed in small, Ziploc bags)

Please review and consider donating some or all of these items. There will be totes at the rear of the sanctuary for your donations. Those attending the Gathering will take the church's contribution to the event. REMEMBER – the Gathering is Saturday, May 31 – please have your donations at the rear of the sanctuary before that date.
