Please read the back of today's bulletin for information on the Bender Family Scholarship Fund.

The Bender Family Scholarship Fund Pollocksville Presbyterian Church Academic Year 2022 - 2023

Mr. and Mrs. James Virgil Bender, Sr. established a scholarship fund in 2004 with a gift to The Presbyterian Foundation. Income from the Fund is to be used to offer financial assistance and encouragement for high school graduates who are pursuing post-secondary school education.

When income from the Fund is sufficient, Pollocksville Presbyterian Church grants one (1) scholarship of \$1,000 per year. Students applying for the scholarship shall indicate financial need and shall have evidenced scholastic ability to successfully engage in higher education studies.

Scholarships shall be awarded only to persons from the church family of Pollocksville Presbyterian Church. The recipient must live in the Pollocksville area and be either a member of Pollocksville Presbyterian Church, or a child or grandchild of a member of Pollocksville Presbyterian Church.

Scholarship recipients may reapply annually (for up to three years) if there are no applicants who meet the criterion of "high school graduates who are pursuing post-secondary school education." Recipients who reapply shall have maintained an annual grade level of 3.0 and shall continue to meet all other requirements of scholarship eligibility.

High school graduates who meet all criteria, including having been accepted for enrollment in a certified college, university, or community college, not to include enrollment in trade programs, will be given first preference.
