  - Leader: Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth; worship the Lord with gladness; come before Him with songs as You enter into His presence.
  - People: We will sing of God's love and justice; and to Him, shall we sing praise.
  - Leader: Let our tongues express God's righteousness and sing of His grace and mercy.
  - People: As God is my refuge, I will sing of His strength, singing praises to Him with song and thanksgiving.
  - Leader: Because of God's steadfast love, I will sing to the Lord as long as I live.
  - People: We will take refuge in God our Savior, rejoicing and ever singing with joy so that all who love the name of the Lord will be filled with music and inspiration.
