THE JESSE TREE

The Jesse Tree is a way of preparing for Advent by journeying through the stories of Jesus' family tree. The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king. And Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree, symbolizing the people, prophesies, and events leading up to Jesus.

Each symbol (ornament) represents a story from within this family tree and a step toward the birth of Jesus. Each Sunday during Advent, we will decorate the Jesse Tree with these ornaments. You will notice that the Jesse Tree is a simple branched tree quite unlike the Christmas trees we decorate. The Jesse Tree is essential to the Christmas story, pointing toward the Messiah, Jesus as the main emphasis to our story. As the tree is gradually decorated, it helps to build anticipation for the celebration of Christmas, marking the arrival of Jesus and the fulfillment of God's promises. Normally, the best scenario is for daily devotions adding an ornament each day until Christmas. There are 25 days in this time span, so 25 ornaments is the common number. However, since we are only utilizing the Tree each Sunday, we will add a number of ornaments to the Tree each week. Take time during these days of Advent to contemplate how the story, people and events touch you this Season. Below is the focus on these ornaments and on each day.

Creation - Genesis 1 - The earth

- 1. Adam & Eve / Garden of Eden Genesis 2-3 A fruit tree or an apple
- 2. Noah & the Flood Genesis 6-9 A rainbow
- 3. God's promise to Abraham Genesis 12:1-7 & Gen. 15:1-6 A tent
- 4. Isaac Genesis 22:1-18 A ram
- 5. Jacob's Ladder Genesis 28:10-19 A ladder
- 6. Joseph's Coat Genesis 37 & Gen. 50 A multicolored coat or robe
- 7. Moses Exodus 2-4 A burning bush
- 8. Israelites and the Passover Exodus 12:1-42 A lamb
- 9. The 10 Commandments Exodus 19-20 Two stone tablets
- 10. Joshua / Fall of Jericho Joshua 6:1-20 A ram's horn trumpet or wall
- 11. Ruth Book of Ruth A sheaf of corn
- 12. King David <u>1 Samuel 16:1-3</u> A six-pointed 'Star of David'
- 13. Solomon's Temple 1 Kings 6 The temple
- 14. Elijah and Baal's Priests 1 Kings 18:16-39 A bonfire
- 15. Isaiah's 'Jesse' Prophecy <u>Isaiah 11:1-11</u> A tree stump
- 16. Jonah and the Whale <u>Book of Jonah</u> **A whale**
- 17. John the Baptist Matthew 3:13-17 A scallop shell
- 18. Mary <u>Luke 1:26-38</u> **A white lily**
- 19. Elizabeth <u>Luke 1:39-56</u> **A mother and child**
- 20. Zechariah <u>Luke 1:57-80</u> A pencil and tablet
- 21. Joseph Matthew 1:19-25 A carpenter's hammer
