Lighting of the Third Advent Candle

Speaker: We light the third candle today representing JOY. It is also often referred to as the Shepherd's Candle," embodies the timeless message of joy that permeates the Christmas narrative and resonates deeply within the hearts of believers. A pink candle signifies joy as it is lit on Gaudete Sunday–named for the entrance antiphon for that Sunday's Mass: "Rejoice (Gaudete) in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice." The light glowing from our Advent wreath is burning brighter. This radiance warms our hearts and fills us with joy! The Lord has done great things for us. Let us rejoice.

Speaker: "May those who sow in tears reap with shouts of joy. Those who go out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6).

The first three candles are lit.

Speaker: Light three candles, see them glow
Brightly, so that all may know
How three candles show the way
Making our darkness bright as God's Day.

The Scripture Readings The Gospel of Luke 1:26-38 (NIV)

²⁶ In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. ³¹ You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end." ³⁴ "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" ³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you.
