²⁸ Then the Jewish leaders took Jesus from Caiaphas to the palace of the Roman governor. By now it was early morning, and to avoid ceremonial uncleanness they did not enter the palace, because they wanted to be able to eat the Passover. ²⁹ So Pilate came out to them and asked, "What charges are you bringing against this man?" ³⁰ "If he were not a criminal," they replied, "we would not have handed him over to you." ³¹ Pilate said, "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." "But we have no right to execute anyone," they objected. ³² This took place to fulfill what Jesus had said about the kind of death he was going to die. ³³ Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus and asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" ³⁴ "Is that your own idea," Jesus asked, "or did others talk to you about me?" ³⁵ "Am I a Jew?" Pilate replied. "Your own people and chief priests handed you over to me. What is it you have done?" ³⁶ Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jewish leaders. But now my kingdom is from another place." ³⁷ "You are a king, then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. In fact, the reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

Christ the King Sunday

Today, is Christ the King Sunday, sometimes referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, and Reign of Christ Sunday. It basically emphasizes the true kingship of Christ. Next week we begin the Advent Season, as we start the new Christian year, but this week we conclude the old ecclesiastical year proclaiming the kingship of our Lord. This Sunday begins the transition from the old and new, and is relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar. It was instituted by Pope Pius XI for the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church in 1925. The world had just emerged from the war "to end all wars" and the signs were everywhere that many were hurting from the war. There was a worldwide economic depression, and people were looking for answers. Of course, there were those who believed they had the answers — the Italian leader Mussolini and the German Hitler. Pope Pius felt it was time to call on Christians to declare their allegiance to the rule of Christ, as failed to understand you can't follow both Christ and the Fuhrer. Thus, the Pope initiated this feast and celebration of Christ the King.

Lutherans, Anglicans, Moravians, Methodists, Nazarenes, Reformed, Presbyterians and other Protestant Churches observe this day in their liturgical season, computed as the final Sunday before Advent. In the <u>Presbyterian Churches</u>, such as the <u>Presbyterian Church (USA)</u>, at the Feast of Christ the King, "the church gives thanks and praise for sovereignty of Christ, who is Lord of all creation and is coming again in glory to reign (see Revelation 1:4-8)."



We simply could not fund our mission without you.




Administration costs at CHA are not frivolous expenditures. These expenses include critical staff training, transportation to rural family locations, extra therapy not covered by insurance, and many other needs not covered by fees for service.

At 12 years old, Maya was living with her aunt in Charlotte, NC. This beautiful dark-haired girl had just finished her first year of middle school when she got her first cell phone. Immediately, she joined social media and began to add her friends online and talk. One in particular was an older high school boy who began flirting with Maya daily. She loved how kind he was and all of the compliments he would give her as she sent him "selfies." But late one night, he asked for her a different kind of picture that he promised he would never show anyone else. Maya worried if she didn't send one he would never talk to her again.

The next day she woke up to messages from her friends telling them to call her immediately. This boy had taken her photos and sent them around. Later that morning, she had her first suicide attempt.

After being stabilized, Maya entered the Intensive In Home (IIH) Therapy Program with CHA. They worked to help Maya and her family heal from this trauma. She is also learning internet safety and getting help to deal with the court system that has taken punitive actions against the boy. One day, with the help of her team, she will be okay and move on to become a strong and confident teenager. Her victimization will not define her.

Child's name and photo have been change for her protection, but her story is very real.
