Call to Confession

How often have we come before the Lord to confess our sins, our mistakes, our wrongs, knowing that the Lord does and will forgive us when we repent. And yet, there are times when we question that forgiveness; is it really true; does God really forgive us, and how often? Scripture reminds us that we are forgiven over and over again, and by His grace, we have the assurance of total forgiveness when we are honest and sincere. With His promise, let us join as a community of faith and offer our confessions in unison, followed by a time of silent reflection. Let us pray...

Unison Prayer of Confession

Loving God, we confess that at times we do not share in the joy of the resurrection but are caught in the worries of the world.

We confess that we do not always live in the spirit of new life but remain discontent, grumbling and anxious. Forgive us for not sharing the Good News. Forgive us when we find it more comfortable to worry, ignore and complain than to risk the joy and encouragement in the new life Christ offers to each of us. Call us back to Your ways, O God, to seek hope and reconciliation, restoration and peace. In the name of the Risen Christ, we pray. Amen.

Silence is Kept

Assurance of God's Pardon (Responsively)

Leader: Christ is Risen! The stone is rolled away, the tomb found empty.

Mary calls out, "I have seen the Lord!" We have seen Christ, too, in every helping hand, in every heartfelt gift, in every choice to renew life in this world. We are called to this new life, a life of forgiveness and reconciliation. Know this -you are forgiven; accept your forgiveness and know that God loves you and desires great joy for your life. Walk forward on this journey of faith, knowing your brothers and sisters are with you.

People: This is good news! God leads us out of the shadows to walk in the light of Christ. This is the word we have heard: our faithful God forgives our sins and raises us to new life. What joy to hear this assurance on Easter Day, Alleluia! Thanks be to God.

Scripture The Gospel Lesson Luke 24:1-12 (NIV)

¹ On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" ⁸ Then they remembered his words. ⁹ When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹ But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹² Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.
